Center for Health Equity \$3,499,175

The work of planning, designing, building, finishing and furnishing the Center for Health Equity was the centerpiece activity of the first six months of 2019. The purpose-built convening space, with the flexibility to host multiple small groups or large gatherings of up to 400 people, was designed to facilitate engagement and enhance the productivity of community members and partners working to fulfill the Foundation's mission of race and health equity. Preparing the Center also included business analysis and logistics planning, wayfinding, public safety, ergonomics, food service operations and lighting, audio, visual and computing technology sufficient to support a wide range of event types.

During the third and fourth quarters of 2019, 69 events were held, attended by nearly 2,400 people. The majority of these were organized and sponsored by the Foundation, but several were large public meetings, hosted by groups including the City of St. Petersburg, County government and the Chamber of Commerce, that had never before been held in a south County location due to lack of a venue of this scale.

The community was involved in a series of meetings to help curate Center spaces to include educational and motivating content for visitors. Based on their ideas, artists and local design firms were commissioned to execute a health equity themed art exhibit and an exhibit on the history of social change and Civil Rights milestones in Pinellas County. In order to ensure equitable access to the Center for Health Equity, a comprehensive, technology-enabled application system for event requests and reservations was planned and engineered and new operating procedures and a website were created.

Equity Movement Building \$733,758

Moving along the continuum from awareness to action in the fulfilment of a social change mission involves a multi-faceted approach to community engagement. The Foundation's 2019 education and awareness-building campaign brought national thought leaders and authors to St. Petersburg to enrich thinking and civic dialogue around race and health equity. Broader public exposure to Foundation influence came via multi-platform messaging, including explanatory videos, social media, media interviews and stories, and staff presentations. Affording frequent opportunities for community partners to learn about race discrimination and health disparities across multiple platforms helped make the case for the Foundation's mission and the decision to build and open the Center for Health Equity. Informational materials were developed to keep Center neighbors and partners throughout the community informed and engaged in the progress of building and programming the Center.

A campaign of 1,000 Voices photographed and interviewed county residents about their aspirations for a more equitable community. These branded messages put faces to the movement and created a sense of momentum. Deeper engagement for those residents seeking to go further in their race equity journey was cultivated through Courageous Conversation about Race: Beyond Diversity (CC:BD) two-day program, now numbering 500 graduates countywide. A small cohort of CCBD graduates were sponsored to receive certification to host and mentor discussion groups book clubs for other graduate to keep skills sharp and commitment strong. Finally, to gauge community readiness and existing involvement with race equity initiatives, a strategic listening effort, organized by sector and sphere of influence, was executed by trained Foundation representatives reflective of the communities they surveyed.

Convening \$432,018

Convening people and organizations to create change grew significantly as a share of overall Foundation effort and investment in 2019. One factor was the launch of the Center for Health Equity, which was powered by an ambitious 100-day plan of programs, events and learning opportunities designed to demonstrate its potential to diverse audiences. Another was the trust gained over several years that Foundation-sponsored multi-sector and mixed-race gatherings and convenings can be powerful tool for community building and problem solving. To empower groups to gain momentum on their social change and

systems change agendas, a major investment was made in training Foundation staff and community leaders in presentation and facilitation skills.

Successful convenings were formed and progress was made on such issues as suicide prevention, infant mortality, affordable housing, educational equity and Black mental health. Foundation-hosted convenings in the Center for Health Equity offered an additional community-building benefit: a place for public, private and nonprofit entities— including the City of St. Petersburg, County Departments of Health and Housing, St. Petersburg Chamber of Commerce and others— to gather in South Pinellas County's underserved south county area. This has helped to diversify event audiences and bring economic benefit and visibility to surrounding businesses and neighborhoods.

Community Investments \$278,699

Abundant support for the nonprofit sector beyond the scope of a single grant or funding cycle is an important way place-based philanthropy can strengthen the entire community ecosystem. Close relationships and deep listening to nonprofit leaders and employees has enabled the Foundation to make strategic ongoing investments that foster resilience and competence in the sector. This has meant tapping national networks to find and fund learning partners, subject matter experts, evaluation consultants and others to help organizations achieve greater impact and efficiency. As the Foundation has pivoted from rounds of responsive grantmaking to idea incubation in pursuit of social change, the door has opened for honest dialogue about what organizations truly need. Rather than polished grant proposals, they share the true obstacles and barriers to multi-sector collaboration and systems change work. These community-driven requests led to support for learning and consultation on such topics as: program evaluation; the LatinX community; board development; equitable economic development; social sector innovation; community research methodology; diversity, equity and inclusion; and collective impact. Additionally, sponsoring opportunities for nonprofits to learn from one another has helped to forge a community of practice and a more proficient and robust nonprofit sector better positioned to collaborate with the corporate, government and faith sectors.
