Primary Objectives & Research Questions

Objective: Provide an updated health equity profile of south St. Petersburg, specifically zip codes 33705, 33711, & 33712.

Research Questions

- 1. What are the greatest racial health disparities for South St. Pete?
- 2. How do community members and stakeholders perceive the health and well -being of their neighborhoods or communities?
- 3. What do residents identify as community priorities?



Methods-Two Parts

Part 1: Informing the Study

11 past studies/reports

Highlighted the opportunity for research to center **community involvement** and an **asset-based approach**.

27 interviews with local leaders & experts

Highlighted the need for research to include multifaceted community involvement and center community voice.



Methods-Two Parts

Part 2: Primary Data Collection

Qualitative

- 7 resident focus groups
- 8 resident ranking activity opportunities
- 1 community mapping activity with residents

Quantitative

Health equity analysis: Census tract, Census Resiliency, & County-level data.



Findings

Common Themes

Across prior studies, local experts, and resident focus groups

- Strong sense of community
- Food access
- Economic challenges
- Health Services
- Gentrification



Findings

Analysis of Census and County Data

The greatest racial disparities in South St. Petersburg compared to Pinellas County were:

- Death due to injury and violence (homicide, firearms, drug overdose, etc.)
- Death due to **chronic disease** (liver cancer, heart disease, diabetes, etc.)
- Census tract -level data not available on mental health



Injury and Violence (rate per 100K)	Pinellas	South St. Pete
Unintentional Injury Deaths	98.2	19.4
Homicide deaths	5.2	40.8
Firearm related deaths	13.4	50.8
Drug poisoning deaths	46.3	132.4

Chronic Disease (rate per 100K)	Pinellas	South St. Pete
Female Breast Cancer Deaths per	34.2	41.9
Liver Cancer Deaths	12.3	28.3
Heart disease deaths	262.6	498.2
Diabetes deaths	37.5	94.2

Data sources: Community Resilience Estimates for Equity Profiles (U.S. Census Bureau) and the FLHealthCHARTS Community Dashboard (Florida Department of Health). Both sources use 2018-2022 5-year estimates from the American Community Survey. The exception is Life Expectancy, which is a 2016-2020 5-year estimate.

78.7 years vs. 73.3 years

Residents of Pinellas County, FL have a life expectancy of 78.7 years compared to 73.3 years for South St. Pete.

4MILES APART 16YEAR GAP

66.5 Campbell Park 82.7
Snell Isle

These disparities are NOT isolated outcomes.

They are the result of deeper systemic issues rooted in the social determinants of health (SDOH).

Social determinants of health (SDOH):

The non-medical factors that affect health outcomes.







Grant Eligibility Criteria

- You may apply for these funds if you have never been a funded partner of the Foundation or if you are a current funded partner, fiscal agent, and/or subcontractor within a currently funded grant.
- Must have an <u>active 501(c)3, 509(a)1, or 509(a)(3)</u>.
- Must have the designation of a tax-exempt organization for <u>a</u> minimum of one year as indicated by the date the IRS officially established the organization as such.

Grant Eligibility Criteria

- FHSP will not fund activities that are political in nature, including lobbying, voter registration, legislative campaigns, or other political activities.
- All funding for the proposed multi-sector collaboration will benefit organizations serving the priority zip codes of 33705, 33711, and/or 33712.
- If your organization has received Foundation funding previously, you must be in compliance with all grant and/or racial equity loan requirements.







